- 3. | Guest Speaker: Samantha Lennon (MK Council Town Deal)

Sam looks after Community Engagement on Town Deal Project (Public Realm) to share information with Stakeholders, communities, businesses.

"Town Deal" is a pot of money allocated by the Government to try to reinvigorate town centres which have suffered post Covid with lack of business. There was a lot of public/online consultations about what the local community wanted and a number of towns applied.

The Bletchley Town Deal Board (made up of

businesses/schools/councillors etc, charities/college) – were awarded £22.7m for specific projects to help attract businesses back to the high street. The projects included providing a better connectivity between cars/bikes/pedestrians, improvements to the train station (as felt it divided west and east). Investment in computers/tech room for colleges etc to get students ready for future businesses to come.

In Bletchley, there are just 5 landlords who 'own' the retail units in Queensway and set rents etc. so working with these to see what can be achieved.

Queensway – Autumn to March. Changes include a one-way street, with two-way cycle track, more parking (15 spaces), preventative measures to stop parking on pavement, more trees, want to bring back market traders, removing bandstand, fixing pavements, more crossings (traffic calming), working on lighting, signage etc. Closing off roads to stop the 'circling' of traffic (Brooklands/Elizabeth Square etc).

Using colours/theme of Bletchley Park (memory ring seating), and streets furniture which is 'fun'/play area, and wooden seating around trees.

Saxon Street – 2026. Council has bought Brunel Centre which will be demolished and rebuilt into retail and houses and will also extend Stanier



Square towards the Train Station. Additional crossings near Lidl's and Albert Street.

Aylesbury Street – 28th July – more of a 'light touch', continuous pavement either side, traffic calming, more planters to stop pavement parking, almost completed Denmark car parking.

4 drop-in sessions are held a month throughout town (Library/Bletchley Council Offices/Leisure centre/Frank Moran Centre) for review/feedback. Can sign up for monthly newsletter updates or send question to info@groundbreakingbletchleyandfenny.co.uk

Questions raised during meeting -

- Q1) Need more toilets (A1) will be taken back to the committee
- Q2) Is there a drive to bring more businesses (A2) yes
- Q3) Leisure Centre Car Park whole of ground is disabled, next level is only for child bays so there is now a lack of parking for everyone else although these two dedicated floors are empty (A3) campaign to fix the lift. Sam will check if any consultation has happened
- Q4) Pathfinder / Health eg 'moving elderly from hospitals to outside' (A4) residents requested a 'Health Hub' but anything else is not part of the scope.
- Q5) What happens when the money runs out (A5) Finite money, no extra funding is available
- Q6) How will things change as the internet etc is making shops redundant.
- (A6) Leighton Buzzard as an example as it is mainly independent shops, cafes etc
- Q7) What will the footfall from Universal Studies be like (A7) Not known at present
- Q8) Is Bletchley Station changing (A8) Platform already there, East side still being discussed
- Q9) What is happening to the cement business (A9) It is remaining and has a dedicated turning
- Q10) Stairs from Station are not great (A10) being discussed as part of East Side expansion
- Q11) What is full timeline (A11) By March 2026 all funding needs to be allocated. Estimated completion is 2027.
- Q12) Will signage be improved (A12) Yes, lots of signage planned
- Q13) Lots of car parking potential not being used (A13) all being looked at
- Q14) Will Bletchley Library remain (A14) Unaware of any other plans at present
- Q15) What about Security cameras (A15) More of a policing matter and town council
- Q16) Red House needing new premises, what can we do to get new premises as only 13 consultation rooms (A16) Will take back and 'nudge' to see if anyone will listen
